

Registration

This year's annual meeting will be hosted from the civic center's parking lot, with members remaining in their vehicles. Registration will begin at 4:30 p.m. To register for the meeting, members may enter the civic center grounds through the east entrance. Employees from both Pioneer Electric and Pioneer Communications will be on-site to assist with parking. Once parked, employees from both cooperatives will come to each vehicle to register members for one or both meetings.

Pioneer Electric members planning to attend the annual meeting will need to register to receive their official ballot for the proposed bylaw changes and for board representation. Those acting as a proxy will also need to have the appropriate card when registering to receive their proxy ballot.

Meals will be delivered to members' vehicles. Please make sure to keep any trash or items to be discarded with you, as trash cans will not be available.

Ballots will be distributed for voting to vehicles as well. Please keep your ballot with you until an employee from Pioneer Electric comes to collect it. Members who wish to register the proxies in advance of the meeting may do so by mailing back the appropriate form or by dropping them off at our office.

Pioneer Electric Annual Meeting

This year's annual meeting will be held in tandem with Pioneer Communications and feature a combined agenda. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. Many changes have been made to the program to allow both cooperatives to conduct their business in a timely fashion.

Board of Trustees Nominees Announced

The 2020 election of the Pioneer Electric Board of Trustees will be held Thursday, Sept. 10, 2020, during Pioneer Electric's annual meeting. This year, three districts are up for election. To become or remain a board member, a person must meet the following qualifications:

- Must be a member and bona fide resident of the particular district they wish to represent.
- ▶ Must not in any way be employed or financially interested in a competing enterprise or a business selling energy or supplies to the cooperative, or a business primarily engaged in selling electrical or plumbing appliances, fixtures or supplies to members of the cooperative.

Nominations

According to Pioneer Electric's current bylaws, it is the duty of the board to appoint a nomination committee no less than 30 days or more than 60 days before the date of the annual meeting. The nomination committee must consist of no less than seven members with at least two members from each district from which each trustee is elected. No member of the board may serve on the committee.

The committee must prepare and post a list of the nominations at the principal office of the cooperative at least 20 days in advance of the meeting. The list must include two candidates for each board position to be filled by the election. The secretary is responsible for mailing, with the notice of the meeting or separately, a statement of the number of board members to be elected and the names and addresses of the nominated candidates at least 10 days prior to the meeting.

Any 15 or more members acting together may make other nominations by petition. The secretary must post such nominations at the same place where the list of nominations made by the committee is posted. Any nominations made by petition, received five days before the meeting, will be included on the official ballot.

Nominations from the floor may also be made during the annual meeting. The chairman will call for any additional nominations from the floor and will remain open for one minute. No member may nominate more than one candidate.

Winners of the election will be announced at the meeting prior to adjournment. Those elected to serve will begin their term on the board immediately. 


Mike Brewer (Incumbent)

2020 Proposed Bylaw Changes Summary

The Pioneer Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("Pioneer Electric" or "Cooperative") Board of Trustees ("Board") propose the following changes to the cooperative's bylaws. The changes will be voted upon at the annual meeting of Pioneer Electric on Sept. 10. A full description of the proposed bylaw changes has been mailed to cooperative members. A brief summary of the changes can be found below. Members may direct questions to Pioneer Electric's staff by calling 620-356-1211.

Certificate of Memberships

Under the current bylaws, new members receive a signed certificate of membership from the board upon starting their service. The proposed changes would remove the requirement of Pioneer Electric to distribute these certificates and all required policies surrounding them.

Annual Membership Meeting Date Requirements

Proposed amendments would remove the requirement that the Pioneer Electric Annual Membership Meeting be held solely during February or March. The proposed changes would extend the time in which the annual meeting could occur to any time between Feb. 1 and Oct. 31 of a given year.

Removal of Proxies and Implementation of Mail Balloting (newly proposed)

The Pioneer Electric Board of Trustees proposes the removal of

voting proxies and the implementation of mail balloting, in addition to in-person voting. This would remove the need for proxies during the election of trustees and in voting on other business items for the cooperative. Mail balloting only will be used in the unusual situation in which the annual meeting, or another business meeting, is unable to be held due to circumstances beyond Pioneer Electric's control.

Process Changes Board of Trustee Qualifications and Petition and Floor Nominations (portions newly proposed):

The proposed amendments will enhance verification of qualification requirements for those wishing to serve on the Pioneer Electric Board of Trustees and eliminate nominations made from the floor during the annual meeting. Under the new amendment, nominations by petition must be submitted, to the cooperative, 45 days before the annual meeting. The Pioneer Electric Board of Trustees shall appoint the committee on nominations, not less than 40 days nor more than 70 days before the date of the Pioneer Electric Annual Membership Meeting. The committee shall prepare and post their nominations, at the principal office of Pioneer Electric, at least 20 days before the annual meeting, and members will be notified of all candidates up for consideration at least 20, but no more than 35, days in advance through a mailing.
