
## Pioneer Electric Cooperative District Map




## **Districts**

Your cooperative's business and affairs are managed by a board of nine members who make up the Board of Trustees. These members are drawn from the nine districts put forth in Pioneer Electric's bylaws.

Each of the first six districts are comprised of approximately the same number of members, so representation is spread evenly throughout the districts, with the final three districts each being composed of two districts. The districts are as follows:

- ▶ District 1: Composed of portions of Hamilton, Stanton, Kearny and Finney Counties, including Manter, Big Bow and portions of Plymell.
- District 2: Composed of portions of Ulysses and Grant County.
- District 3: Composed of portions of Ulysses and Grant County.
- District 4: Composed of portions of Ulysses, Grant and Haskell Counties.
- District 5: Composed of portions of Stanton, Stevens and Morton Counties, including Richfield and Rolla.
- District 6: Composed of portions of Seward, Stevens, Grant and Haskell Counties, including Hickok, Ryus and Moscow.
- District 7: Composed of districts one and two.
- District 8: Composed of districts three and four.
- District 9: Composed of districts five and six.





## Pioneer Electric Cooperative Service Map




Pioneer Electric Cooperative serves approximately 16,600 meters and 4,800 members, maintaining 22 substations and 4,100 miles of distribution lines, with 280 miles of transmission lines running through the area. That is quite a lot from our humble beginnings of just 74 members!

Pioneer Electric also manages Southern Pioneer Electric, a wholly owned subsidiary of Pioneer Electric. Southern Pioneer serves 16,939 meters and 1,200 miles of distribution lines throughout 10 counties. Combined that is over 30,000 meters and 5,000 miles of line, covering 20 counties.


## **Pioneer Electric in Kansas**

Pioneer Electric is one of 29 cooperatives operating in Kansas. Kansas is one of 47 states where electric cooperatives can be found, with over 900 cooperatives serving over 40 million people nationwide.

While electric cooperatives serve only about 12 percent of the country's population, they own and maintain 42 percent of the distribution lines in America, covering three quarters of the country.
